

STANDARD PREVENTIVE MEASURES

... are referred to as measures to be implemented for all residents whenever they come in contact with body fluids such as vomit, feces, or blood, based on the idea that **all people carry pathogens (viruses, bacteria, etc.) that can be transmitted.**




Effective preventive measures

1. Hand hygiene (Hand washing and sanitizing)

2. Use of personal protectiveequipment (PPE)(Masks, gloves, goggles, face shields,plastic apron and impermeable gown, etc.)

HOW TO WEAR AND TAKE OFF A MASK

- 1. Use a non-woven mask (surgical mask)
- 2. Make it fit to your face with no gap
- \rightarrow Choose a mask that fits your size.
- \rightarrow Extend the mask under your chin to match the shape of your nose.
- 3. Hold the strings to take off a mask






TRANSMISSION ROUTES THAT ARE EASILY OVERLOOKED

by contact ... Touching the mucous membranes of eyes, nose, or mouth with virus-contaminated fingers.

People "unconsciously" touch their faces!

HAND HYGIENE (Hand washing and sanitizing)

Hand washing



1. Wet both hands with water.



2. Dispense an appropriate amount of soap.



3. Wash the palms of hands with well-whipped soap.



4. Wash the spaces between fingers.



5. Wash the backhands.



6. Rub the palms of hands with fingertips.



7. Wash the thumbs with the opposite hand in a twisting motion.



8. Wash the wrists in a twisting motion.



9. Rinse off the soap under running water.



10. Dry hands by tapping with paper towel.



11. Use a paper towel that you dried your hands to turn off the hold down the water lever to turn off the water.

Check ! Make sure to wash the hands thoroughly!

- Finger tips
- Space between fingers
- Wrists



After rubbing your hands for 10 seconds, rinse off the soap under running water for 15 seconds.

Always use soap and water for visible dirt, otherwise either use hand sanitizer or wash hands with soap and water.

Keep always the washroom clean and dry. Do not place hand sanitizers, etc. near the basin as water can splash easily.

• Hand sanitizing



1. Dispense sanitizer into the palm of your hand.



2. Dip fingertips in accumulated hand sanitizer and rub into palms.



3. Sanitize the palms of your hands.

5. Rub the back side of hands.



6. Sanitize the space between fingers.



7. Wash the thumbs with the opposite hand in a twisting motion.



8. Sanitize the wrists in a twisting motion and finally rub the both hands until dry.

CHECK ! Use hand sanitizer in a quantity that spread into your entire hand. (about 2-3 mL)

NG ! Do not refill hand sanitizer or liquid soap before using it up. Wash the container and dry to refill.



Take care of your hands as well, as rough hands can make it difficult to remove dirt.
Make it a habit to wash and sanitize your hands before and after assisting meal, toileting and cleaning.


PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE) DONNING AND DOFFING POINTS

- ✓ Review or double-check the procedures (No one is 100% perfect!)
- Don't walk around in PPE (Don't let the virus spread around!)


Take special precautions when taking off the PPE

- Sanitize your hands every time you take off your gloves, gowns, and masks.
- Keep clean the outside of the garbage bag to dispose used PPE (Do not touch the outside of the PPE as they are considered as contaminated materials!)

How to take off personal protective equipment (PPE)In the case of plastic gowns with neck and waist straps that can be easily torn off



How to take off personal protective equipment (PPE) In the case of non-woven gowns with neck and waist straps that can NOT be torn off



Wheneve not panic of your P

Personal protective equipment should be taken off in the correct way and order to avoid contact with the virus when undressing. If possible, work in pairs, checking with each other.

Whenever you feel that your hands have accidentally "touched a contaminated surface," do not panic and apply hand sanitizer each time. You may do so every time you take off a piece of your PPE.
